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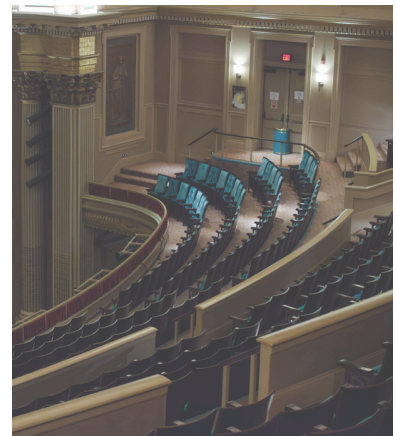

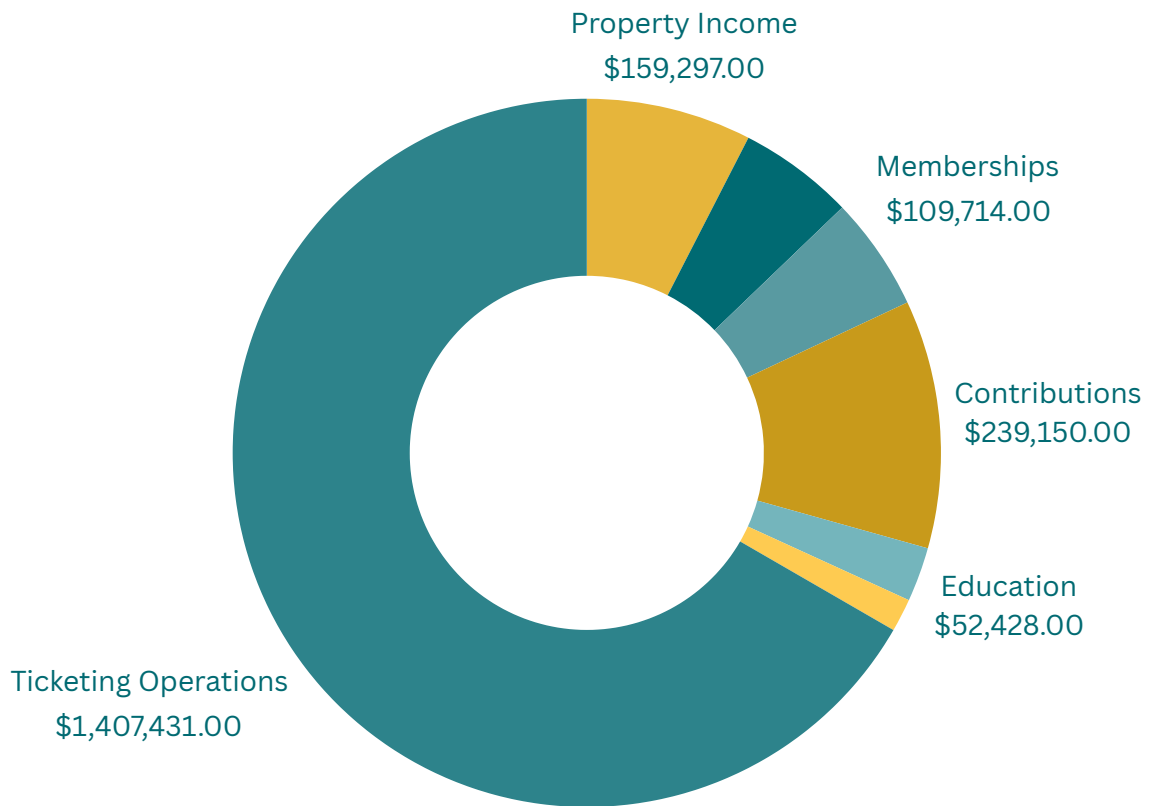

# Financial Performance An Overview

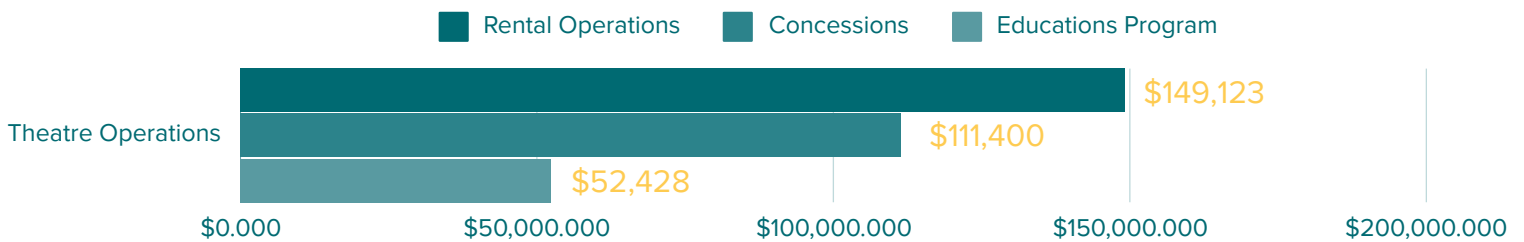
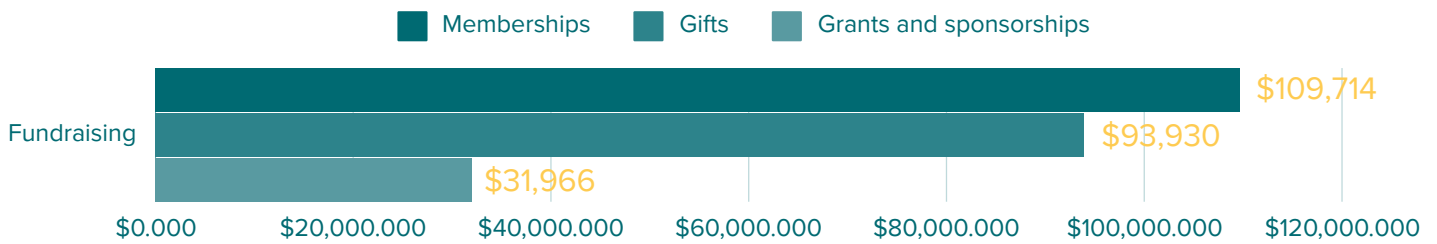
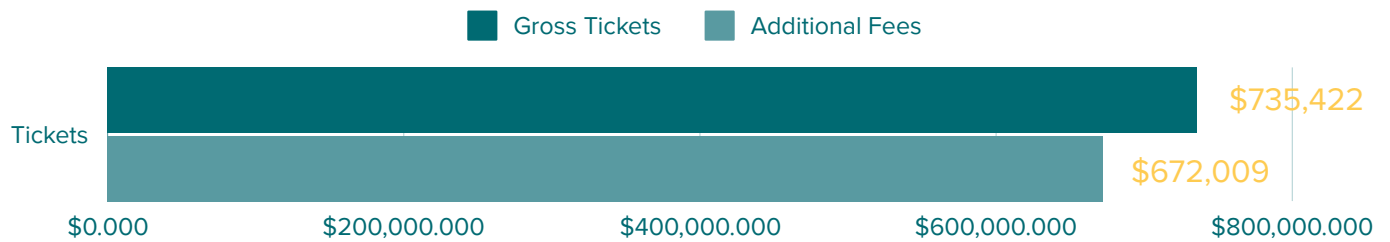
Despite the challenges of 2020, Hawai'i Theatre Center maintained strong financial support across key areas:
